Neighborhood Patrol & Non-Emergency Situation

Our C.H.S.P.S. volunteers provide two services for residents: Evening Patrol & Vacation Watch. During the evening, they patrol our streets and look for security breaches, suspicious vehicles, street light outages, and road hazards to report to authorities. For resident who sign up for nation watch, C.H.A.P.S. will periodically inspect the outside of your home, check doors and windows, and also pick up flyers and papers. Service is available to those who will be away from the homes for a period of 14 or more days. C.H.A.P.S. differs from Association Patrol as they patrol the neighborhoods and not the common areas.
